

The Student Health Advisory Council met on October 2, 2014, to vote on the human sexuality program to be used at Piner Middle School for grades seven and eight starting with the 2014-15 school year. Information about six programs had been given to the members so that they could research each program before this night's meeting. After some discussion, members ranked each program on a ballot. The program that came in first place was the Worth the Wait program from Scott and White Health Care. This program went to the school board for recommendation for implementation.

SHAC also discussed further looking into human sexuality training for other grade levels particularly grades 4, 5, and 6 with a graduated approach to the training. The health TEKS for grades four and five were passed out to the group so they could see what was currently being taught at those levels. The group was informed that most human sexuality programs did have a grade 6 component available which leads into the grades 7 and 8 programs. At the next meeting, the group will further discuss this and the possibility of making this a recommendation to the school board.
